

Danielology of the Revelation

- I. Scenes of Heaven and Earth
 - a. Daniel 7-12—Rev
 - b. These scenes are of war, calamity and triumph on earth and the spiritual realm
- II. The man with the gold belt is strikingly similar to that describing Jesus in Rev 1.12-15, the “might angel” with the “little scroll” Rev 10.1-7
 - a. Angel in Dan 12 and Rev 10 stand on the water with hands raised to heaven swearing by him who lives forever, one that time will pass then the end the other that time has passed and “there would be no more”
- III. Spiritual Warfare
 - a. Eph 6.12, Rev 12.7-12 Satan cast down and “unto you”
 - b. Satan and his demons use his influence to persuade nations to “make war” Rev 12.17
 - c. He is the great “accuser” Rev 12.10 behind the “little horn” of Dan 7.20 who “wears out the saints” Dan 7.25
- IV. Both Daniel and Revelation are written to an oppressed people which will be further oppressed.
 - a. These demonstrate to us how God’s people are to live and operate during oppression. “came to make you understand what is to happen to your people in the latter days.” Dan 10.14, I Jn 2.18, Acts 2.17, Heb 1.2, Jude 18
 - b. These demonstrate what is meant by 2 Tim 3.13 during the last days
- V. Latter days = 3 ½ times = 1260 days = 42 months
 - a. Dan 7.25→ in response to desiring “to know the truth” (19) he is told the little horn will persecute for “**times time and half a time**” or 3 ½ times
 - b. Dan 12.7→ in response to “how long shall it be till the end” (6) – “times time and half a time”
 - c. Dan 7:11, 25-27; 11:36-12:3, Rev 11, 12 and 13
 - i. All discussing the progressive persecution up to “great tribulation” of God’s people in latter days and triumph at the end
 - ii. “and they shall trample the holy city **42 months**” Rev 11:2
 - iii. “they will prophesy for **1260 days**” Rev 11.3
 - iv. Woman in the wilderness is:
 1. “nourished for **1260 days**: Rev 12.6
 2. “nourished for a **time, times and half a time**” Rev 12.14
 - v. The beast exercises “authority for **42 months**” Rev 13.5
- VI. The “little horn” Dan 7
 - a. “the king” of Dan 11.36
 - b. “that antichrist” I Jn 2.18
 - c. “man of lawlessness” 2 Thess 2.1-12
 - d. “beast from the sea” Rev 13.1
 - i. Comes from the sea as in Dan 7—Rev 13.1
 - ii. Beast has features of the first 3 beast in Daniels vision Dan 7—Rev 13.2
 - iii. Uses his mouth against God and his people Dan 7.11, 25—Rev 13.5

- iv. Makes war with the saint Dan 7.21—Rev 13.7
- VII. Progressive Tribulation
 - a. 2 Tim 3.13
 - b. “wear out the saints” “and prevailed”, “given into his hand” Dan 7.25, 21, 25. “enter the glorious land” “and there shall be a time of trouble” 11.44; 12.1. “will make war with them, overcome them and kill them”, “to make war.. on those who keep the commandments”, “to make war on the saints and conquer them” Rev 11.7; 12.17, 13.7
- VIII. “Written in the book” “court shall sit in judgement”
 - a. Discussing the final day--Dan 7.26, Dan 12.1 (early used Ex 32.32), Rev 13.8, Rev 20.12
- IX. Resurrection
 - a. Of the dead or Israel?
 - i. Dan 12.2 used by Jesus John 5.28-29
 - ii. Same scene as that used in Dan 7.26, Rev 20.12
 - iii. Scene seems to be the latter days not the end of the former days
- X. “Here is the faith and patience of the Saints”
 - a. Rev 13:10, Rev 14:12-13, Dan 12:12-13
- XI. Other Revelation references
 - a. Sea of glass (representing peace) 4.6—Dan 7.2 compare to sea of chaos
 - b. Lamb takes book 5.8—Dan 7.13 lamb presented
 - c. Redeemed, kindred, tongue, people and nation and made the redeemed kings and priest 5.9-10—Dan 7.27 “given to the people”
 - d. 10000x10000 5.11—Dan 7.10
 - e. “How long”, “yet for a little season” 6.10-11—Dan 12.6 “how long shall it be”
 - f. Clothed in cloud and rainbow, little book, feet of fire, voice of thunder, lifts hands to heaven and declares the end, commands a message to peoples, nations, tongues and kings Rev 10—Dan 10.5-6 and 12.7
 - g. Babylon is fallen and flame for those who worship beast and image 14.8-11—Dan 3
 - h. “blessed are they that die in the Lord” 14.13—Dan 12.2
 - i. Victors on the “sea of glass” Rev 15.2—Dan 7.2 compare to sea of chaos
 - j. “unclean spirits” working Rev 16.13-14—Dan 10.20
 - k. “the woman”, “BABYLON THE GREAT” “beast” Rev 17—Dan 7, 12
 - l. “Babylon the great is fallen” 18.2—Dan 2.35 “became like chaff”, 7.26 “take away his kingdom”
 - m. “the fruits thy soul lusted after” Rev 18.14—Dan 1. “purposed in his heart not to defile himself”
 - n. “God hath avenged you” Rev 18.20—Dan 12.1 “thy people shall be delivered”
 - o. “by thy sorceries were all nations deceived” 18.23--Dan 1.4 “teach the learning and tongue of the Chaldean”
 - p. “armies which were in heaven followed him” 19.11-16—Dan 4.35
 - q. “from whose face the earth and heaven fled away” 20.1—Dan 2.35 “and the wind carried them away”

- r. "and the dead were judged" 20.12—Dan 12.1-2 "shall awake"
- s. "shall reign forever and ever" 22.5—Dan 7.27 "shall be given to the people of the saints"
- t. "things which must shortly be done" Rev 22.6—Dan (10.11, 21; 11.1)
- u. Rev 22.10-11—Dan 12.9-10
